Further, new NIH policy is that renewal grant funding will be held up until we provide a PMCID number for all publications resulting from the study.

Some journals will automatically submit your final peer-reviewed manuscript to PubMed Central; however, many journals will not do this automatically and it will be your obligation to deposit the final manuscript in PubMed Central. It is your responsibility to be certain that a PMCID number is obtained for your manuscript and provide that and a pdf of the published manuscript to COPDGene<sup>®</sup> as soon as possible after the manuscript is accepted for publication.
