It is required by the NHLBI that all publications resulting from NIH funding be available through PubMed Central. The NIH requires us to provide PMCID numbers for all publications resulting from the COPDGene® grant when we send our annual reports to the NIH (due June 1st each year). Further, new NIH policy is that renewal grant funding will be held up until we provide a PMCID number for all publications resulting from the study.

Some journals will automatically submit your final peer-reviewed manuscript to PubMed Central; however, many journals will not do this automatically and it will be your obligation to deposit the final manuscript in PubMed Central. This can be done via NIHMS. Information on how to accomplish this is available online (http://publicaccess.nih.gov/submit Process.htm).

It is your responsibility to be certain that a PMCID number is obtained for your manuscript and provide that and a pdf of the published manuscript to COPDGene® as soon as possible after the manuscript is accepted for publication.
